The **RKWN** has selected SisterWorks as its charity to support for this year. We have a set of shared values and a vision to **empower**, **connect** and **develop**. **SisterWorks** is a Not-for-Profit social organisation with a mission to support women who are refugees, asylum seekers or migrants. The organisation strives to improve women's confidence, wellbeing and sense of belonging, and help them to become economically empowered.

There will be the opportunity to purchase some of the products that have been hand crafted by the **SisterWorks** community. The products include homewares, kitchenwares, preserves and body products.

This event will be catered by Free to Feed which was founded in late 2015. They assist asylum seekers to find meaningful employment opportunities using their existing skills and experiences which facilitates community interconnectivity, as well as breaking the sense of social isolation often faced by these new arrivals. It is a not-for-profit social enterprise in awe of the potential and spirit of refugees, people seeking asylum and new migrants – and appreciative of what they offer as new community members.

As a political refugee, Luz arrived in Australia in 2010, with my life in tatters and spoke no English. In 2011, along with a group of 25 women experiencing similar challenges, Luz began to make and sell crafts around Melbourne.

SisterWorks Inc. was born in May 2013 when a committee of volunteers joined us with legal, fund-raising, marketing, and administrative skills to give support and structure to the project. Today, SisterWorks is a not-for-profit social enterprise 'Handmade with Love in Melbourne'. Through work and entrepreneurship, Luz's mission continues to be supporting women who are refugees, asylum seekers or migrants to improve their confidence, mental wellbeing and sense of belonging.
